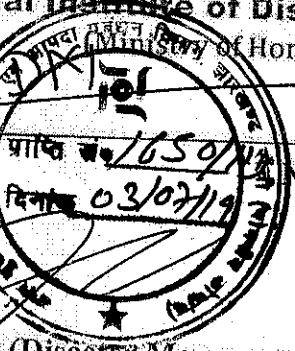

The National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India is engaged in capacity building of professionals of cross-sectoral departments both at the national level and in collaboration with the states to fulfill its mandate for disaster risk reduction and safe development.

India is going through a process of rapid urbanization; with about 377 million people inhabiting the urban centres. The rapid, mostly haphazard growth has led to high risk situations and increased urban vulnerability. Ensuring urban resilience requires a participatory and inclusive approach to planning and development of cities. This assumes greater importance in the context of the recent schemes and programmes like the SMART Cities, AMRUT and HRIDAY launched by the Government of India. 12 cities of Tamil Nadu have been included in the SMART Cities programme.

2. NIDM proposes to organize a Training Programme on Mainstreaming DRR into City Development Plans from 23-25 July, 2019 at New Delhi. The objective of the programme is to train senior and mid-level officials in Urban Development Departments, Town Planning & Housing, Urban Local Bodies, City Development Authorities and related Government organizations on tools and methodology for integrating DRR in the city planning process.

3. You are requested to kindly facilitate the nominations of one or two senior/ middle level officials from the state government departments of Revenue, Urban development, town planning, PWD, etc. The nominations must reach NIDM (nidmtrgcell@gmail.com) with a copy to chandrani.nidm@nic.in latest by 17th July, 2019. NIDM would bear the expenditure on boarding & lodging, reading material, working lunch of the participants while other expenditures will have to be borne by nominating agency/ organization.

TRAINING PROGRAMME ON MAINSTREAMING DISASTER RISK REDUCTION IN CITY DEVELOPMENT PLANS

23-25 July 2019

CONTEXT

Disasters contribute to social, economic, cultural and political disruption within vulnerable communities. The intrinsic relationship between disasters and development is manifested repeatedly in the human, material and economic loss from disaster events. Mainstreaming of Disaster Risk Reduction activities into the development process is imperative in our present context of risk.

India is going through a process of rapid urbanization; with about 377 million people inhabiting the urban centres. The urban population is expected to grow exponentially in the next 30 years. The rapid, mostly haphazard growth has led to high risk situations and increased urban vulnerability. Ensuring urban resilience requires a participatory and inclusive approach to planning and development of cities. In keeping with the Hyogo framework for Action (HFA) and Sendai Framework, mainstreaming disaster risk reduction into development is a priority action where disaster governance and investment in reducing risk are important action points. In this context, National Institute of Disaster Management, New Delhi is organizing a 3 day training programme on "Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction in City Development Plans" at its Delhi campus.

ABOUT NIDM

The National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), Ministry of Home Affairs (Government of India) is a centre of excellence and learning in the field of disaster management. It is a premier resource institution for human resource development, training, capacity building, applied research, implementation and dissemination of information and knowledge for holistic disaster management. - Describe the strategies for holistic risk prevention, mitigation, preparedness and response to be integrated within the city planning process.
